






















## **Amy Backel**

Amy Backel is a 2005 graduate of Northern High School. Her athletic journey has been blessed with exceptional coaches and her induction into the West Shore Chapter of the PA Hall of Fame should be viewed as a testament to the programs she had the honor to be a part of and the coaches that contributed their time, passion, and knowledge to her development.

Amy walked into her first day of high school track practice as an average middle distance runner and enthusiastic high jumper. Continuing to improve in the high jump and adding pole vault to her repertoire she knew she enjoyed the sport, but it was an introduction to the concept of the heptathlon after her sophomore season that really solidified her interest and started a decade-long obsession with track and field. The multi-event required Amy to learn the hurdles, shotput, long jump, javelin, and train for the 200m and 800m runs, and of course continue to train for the high jump. With only a few weeks to prepare for her first heptathlon she was fortunate to have the Northern coaching staff, experts in their respective events, nearby to help and encourage her.

Without an introduction to the heptathlon Amy may have never picked up a javelin, or shotput, or taken a serious interest in strength training. And without the caring and dedicated coaches she had early in her career, she may have never had a desire to coach in the future. Needless to say, the sport and the NHS coaching staff had a lasting impact.

Amy graduated from NHS with five school records (4 currently standing), she was a 2005 Nike High-School All-


American in the indoor pentathlon, the 2005 Penn Relays runner-up in the javelin, an 8-time PIAA State Medalist (high jump, javelin, shotput, pole vault), and 2005 John Travers Award winner.


Amy continued her track career at the University of Oklahoma. Her trend of falling into programs with exceptional coaches continued, as she competed for Jeremy Fischer (current head jumps coach at the US Olympic Training Center in Chula Vista) in her first year as a heptathlete. Brian Blutreich, who has coached multiple Olympians, NCAA Champions, and over 60 All-Americans, graciously accepted Amy into his throwing program once joining the OU coaching staff in 2007. Within the first year of focusing on throwing exclusively under Coach Blue, Amy was qualified for the 2008 Olympic Trials in the javelin.

Amy graduated from the University of Oklahoma as a two-time NCAA All-American, OU's first ever 3-time Academic All-American, and 2010 Big XII Champion in the javelin. She was an eight-time All-Big XII performer (heptathlon, shotput, javelin) and ended her collegiate career with a 6th place finish at the 2010 USA Championships.

Amy decided to remain at OU to complete her masters degree in Civil Engineering, continue to train for the 2012 Olympic Trials, and serve as a volunteer assistant coach for Brian Blutreich after graduating. Battling injury in 2012, she again qualified for the Olympic Trials and was honored to end her track and field career in the finals of the 2012 Olympic Trials at historic Hayward Field in Eugene, Oregon.

Amy currently resides in Denver, Colorado where she is a bridge designer for EST, Inc. She enjoys continuing to train and compete in CrossFit, Olympic weightlifting, and Scottish Highland Games. She is a volunteer throws coach at a local high school and has several athletes learning the javelin despite it not being sanctioned in Colorado. It is her constant goal to pay forward the generosity of the coaches that helped shape her over the years.















## **Robyne Bostick**

Robyne Bostick is a 1989 graduate of Trinity High School and a 1993 graduate of St. Joseph's University; she received a master's degree in Sport Administration from the University of Northern Colorado in 2009.

While at Trinity, Robyne participated in volleyball, basketball, and track and field. Playing for legendary head coach, Harry DeFrank, Robyne helped the Shamrocks win four Mid Penn League championships, three District III Class AA titles, and one PIAA Class AA State Championship. She finished her career at Trinity with an overall record of 115-12, and currently ranks seventh on the all-time scoring list with 1,269 points. Robyne was named to the Patriot News Big 15 team in both 1988 and '89.

Robyne was also a standout in volleyball and track and field. She was a four-year letter winner on the Shamrock volleyball team, and a Mid Penn Division II First Team All-Star. In track and field, Robyne set the school record in the high jump during her freshman year.

Robyne chose to continue her education and basketball career at St. Joseph's University in Philadelphia. Following a medical redshirt year during the 1989-90 season, Robyne went on to earn the Philadelphia Big 5 Rookie of the Year award in 1991. St. Joe's won the overall Big 5 title during each of Robyne's four years on Hawk Hill. During her senior year at St. Joseph's, Robyne led the team in scoring with 15 points per game, and rebounding with 7.6 per game. The Hawks finished with a 19-9 record, including two wins over teams ranked in the Top 25, and earned an at large bid to the NCAA Tournament. Following her senior season, Robyne was named to the Atlantic 10 All-Conference 1st Team, won the Philadelphia Big 5 Player of the Year Award, was named the Most Valuable Player for her team, and was a Kodak All-American Honorable mention selection. Her career field goal percentage is the 10th highest in St. Joe's women's basketball history.

After graduating from college, Robyne had the opportunity to play professional basketball overseas and signed a contract with Team Residence Walferdange in Luxembourg where her success on the court continued. Robyne played for two seasons in Luxembourg, with her team winning the Coupe de Luxembourg during her second season, while averaging nearly 30 points and 15 rebounds per game.


After narrowly missing an opportunity to be drafted by a team in the American Basketball League (ABL), Robyne's passion for the game led her to become an assistant coach at James Madison University. Robyne has also coached at Vanderbilt University, the United States Air Force Academy,

Princeton University, Long Island University, Northern Arizona University, and just completed her first season as Associate Head Coach at the University of Missouri-Kansas City.

Following her two years of coaching at Long Island University, Robyne made a career change and worked for two years as a Morale, Welfare, and Recreation supervisor on U.S. military bases in Tikrit and Kirkuk, Iraq. She was responsible for implementing sports and recreation programs for soldiers and airmen deployed to those bases during Operation Iraqi Freedom. Robyne also worked in sports and recreation at Fort Carson, Colorado, before returning to the sidelines as an assistant coach at Northern Arizona in 2012.

Robyne is the daughter of Ron and Narvia Bostick. She grew up in a sports family with all three of her siblings playing multiple sports in high school. Her older brother, Ryan, and younger brother, Randy, both played basketball at Trinity. Robyne inherited her love of basketball from her father, who played basketball at the University of Wyoming and during his time in service for the U.S. Air Force, he was inducted into the Saratoga Springs High School (NY) Hall of Fame in 2016.

In 2000, Robyne was inducted into both the Philadelphia Big 5 Hall of Fame and the St. Joseph's Women's Basketball Hall of Fame. She is also a member of the inaugural class of the Trinity Athletic Hall of Fame.





## Larry Kostelac, Jr.

Larry Kostelac Jr. is part of a three generation family that has greatly influenced Trinity High School and its athletics. His father served as the former Dean of Students and boys' basketball coach at Trinity. Son Larry III is a former player on Trinity's first state championship team and currently serves on the coaching staff as assistant coach. Son Tyler played on an Eastern finalist and a state quarter finalist team and was on the Trinity coaching staff for six years.

As a 1976 graduate of Trinity, Larry exceled in basketball under Coach Steve "Reno" Fuhrman earning spots on both the Central Penn Catholic League and South Central League All-Star teams multiple seasons throughout his high school career. During his senior season, he was selected for the Patriot News Big 15 and awarded the Central Pennsylvania Old Times Associations Class B Player of the Year.

Following graduation, Larry continued his basketball career for Shippensburg University under the direction of Coach Rodger Goodling from 1976-1980. During his collegiate career, Larry was a two year starter averaging eight points per game as a guard. A career-ending knee injury his senior year led to the start of his coaching career when he joined the coaching staff of Shippensburg's Junior Varsity team.

Even more impressive than his playing career, he returned to his alma mater in 1984 where he has led the Trinity boys' basketball program to unprecedented success. As of March 17, 2018, Kostelac holds a winning record of 699-280 and was named the PIAA Class AA Coach of Year in both 2001 and 2003. Like all great coaches, Kostelac has a knack for inspiring players to win big games. Throughout his career, he has led his players to 14

Mid Penn Championships, 16 District 3 Championships, 10 PIAA Final 4 appearances, five PIAA Eastern Championships. Additionally, he has lead teams to the state championship as a three-time PIAA State Runner Up, and winning two PIAA State Championship crowns.


Larry is the son of the late Lawrence and Virginia Kostelac and the first of five children. The Trinity High tradition has stayed at the heart of the family, as all children and 10 grandchildren have contributed athletically and academically to the school.

Larry and his wife Lori reside in Mechanicsburg where he is retired, in 2016, from the Naval Sea Logistics Center as the Director of Corporate Operations. He currently serves as the Director of Athletic Advancement at Trinity. Larry has four children and seven grandchildren: son Larry III and Becki Kostelac, children Carter, Brooklyn, Madison, and Lawrence IV; daughter Leah Kostelac and Joe Lauer, children Emma and Joey; son Tyler and Rachel Kostelac, daughter Corrine; and son Michael Martino all reside in Mechanicsburg.









1990 Champion Bill Patrowicz, Wisconsin



### William Patrowicz

Mr. Patrowicz is a 1986 graduate of Cedar Cliff High School and a 1991 graduate of the University of Wisconsin-Madison. Bill started his NCAA Division I track and field career as a walk-on javelin thrower at Virginia Tech. He transferred to the University of Wisconsin-Madison to accept an athletic scholarship and to train under legendary track and field coach Ed Nuttycombe. He would later compete internationally representing the United States in the sports of Track and Field and Bobsled.

Bill's athletic career at Cedar Cliff High School was fairly ordinary, though he did earn a varsity letter in soccer and track and field and also participated in junior varsity football and baseball. He also was an avid high school ice hockey player on travel teams based out of Mechanicsburg and York.

At Virginia Tech, Bill had the opportunity to grow from a high school javelin thrower (that he notes, "barely qualified for Districts and did not qualify for States") to the university's record holder of 219'2" two years later. He credits his growth and performance not only to his training under strength and conditioning coach Dr. Mike Gentry and Olympian Gudmundur Helgasson but he was also to a part of a close knit team of javelin throwers.

That team was comprised of Dr. Jonathan Patrowicz (his younger brother), Dr. Bryan Smith (a fellow Cedar Cliff graduate who not only introduced Bill to the sport but also his future wife Ayn), and Jonathan Stabile (a current PAC-12 football official).

In his two seasons with the Badgers, he set a new Wisconsin school record and a new Big Ten record each year (1990 and 1991). He won two Big Ten Championships and was first team all-Big Ten Conference

Track and Field Team both years. In 1991, he was also named Wisconsin's "Outstanding Field Event Athlete." Of note, Bill cross-trained during the summers with Casey Fitzrandolph, who would later win a 2002 Olympic Gold Medal in speedskating (500m). At Wisconsin, Bill was twice elected president of the Wisconsin Student-Athlete Association and later worked with the Big Ten Conference and the NCAA to model Wisconsin's success in student-athlete representation.


Bill went on to compete for the US Army Track and Field team, to compete internationally, and to achieve a USA Masters All-American designation in 2009. His career record was 241'2".


In the late 1990's, Bill competed in the Bobsled, where he qualified as a National A-Team member but missed going to the 1998 US Olympics. Bill was a push athlete for the late Steve Holcomb – a then rookie driver who would later win Olympic Gold. In 1998, he also ran for Vice Chairman of the United States Bobsled and Skeleton Federation but lost by two votes.

Bill, his wife Ayn, and their three children live in Canandaigua, NY. He is a business development professional,

elected leader, and veteran. He works with law enforcement, homeland security, and national security organizations in ten nations. He is also being considered to serve as the next US Ambassador to Iceland.









## **Shelly Stallsmith**

All it took was one writer to point Shelly in the right direction. One sports writer who knew not only how to turn a phrase, but how to tell the news in a manner that made you want to read a story just because he wrote it.

In the late 1970s and early 1980s, it was all about newspapers. Writers and photographers covered games, matches and meets so that athletes, parents and grandparents had stories and photos to fill scrapbooks. Shelly had that in her years at Central York High School. An all-state volleyball career that led to an all-conference player in four years at Shippensburg University produced plenty of copy. It gave her an idea of what she wanted to do - when she got older - and how she wanted to do it. A newspaper career that started with freelance jobs at the York Sunday news during high school has now spanned nearly 40 years.

Her first stop on the full-time newspaper train was at The Sentinel in Carlisle. In 1987 she helped to break through the glass ceiling of the male-dominated sports journalism world by becoming one of the first – if not the first - female sports editor of a daily newspaper in Pennsylvania. At that time, The Sentinel covered all nine high schools in Cumberland County plus West Perry and Northern York. In addition to developing coverage plans for the small staff, Shelly covered field hockey, girls' basketball, volleyball, soccer and softball.

Over the next eight years, Shelly wrote about league, district and state champions, about athletes recovering from horrendous injury or illness and about the business of sports. Some of the stories were heartbreaking and others were heartwarming. She met tremendous athletes who played for the love of sport and for the chance to extend their education. She met coaches who took the blame when

their teams won and none of the credit when they won. She met administrators who fought for every penny of their school's budgets so that students didn't lose other types of programs so that athletes could play. Some carry familiar names, not just locally, but throughout the world of sport. Billy Owens, Nancy Lopez, Billy Jean King, Jimmy Connors are just a handful. Big-ticket events were covered: an NFC championship, the Lady Keystone Open, USA volleyball matches were peppered among the high school

events.

Shelly's career continued in a variety of sports roles at The Patriot-News, and then PennLive for more than 16 years. It was during those years that she produced a special section celebrating the 40th anniversary of Title IX. She led a team of reporters, editors and photographers as they interviewed 40 women of different generations. Women who talked about their sports

lives before the historic legislation; women who talked about the early years and teens who grew up with seemingly unlimited opportunity.

Shelly now leads sports for the York Daily Record, taking her back to where it all began. The challenge now is to tell those stories in a variety of ways that resonates with the ever-changing world of journalism. And maybe along the way, there will be an athlete out there who likes what


they read or sees enough to start them down their own career path.














## **Coy Wire**

When Coy Wire was just seven years old, all he talked about was playing football. He had a very prolific youth career in both football and wrestling where he became an Eastern National AAU wrestling champion out of 12 states at just nine years old.

Coy went on to have an outstanding scholastic career at Cedar Cliff HS. He was a three-time AAA District III Wrestling champion, a two-time PIAA Runner up, and set many school records in football as a running back. Coy had the honor of being coached by the legendary Bob Craig. He was named a co-captain of the PA Big 33 team in 1997, and was accepted at Stanford University on a football scholarship. There, Coy would lead Stanford in rushing as a freshman and also in the 2000 Rose Bowl against Wisconsin. He switched positions to linebacker his junior year and became the first player in Stanford history to lead the team in rushing one year and in tackles another. He was then drafted in the third round of the NFL draft by the Buffalo Bills where he would play for six seasons.

During Coy's time with the Bills he received the "Walter Payton Man of the Year" award and the "Ed Block Courage" award. After spinal fusion neck surgery he was released by the Bills in 2007. In 2008, he signed with the Atlanta Falcons where he would play for three more years before retiring.

Coy was a captain of every football team he ever played on. After retiring he took his talents to the world of media. First, with the PAC-12 Football Network doing TV analysis for college football games and then to Fox Sports where he would do the same. While with Fox, Coy earned a "Regional Emmy Award for his work as On-Camera talent – Performer/Narrator/ Program Host/Moderator/Play-by-Play".


In 2013, he was hired by CNN to be a sports anchor. Today, Coy does the "Bleacher Reports" for CNN and HLN and has covered many major sporting events including two Super Bowls, the Rio Olympics, Kentucky Derby, Indy 500, NCAA

College Championship football games, Army/Navy Game, and the 2018 Olympics in South Korea.

Coy has had a lot of support along his journey. His parents, Rick and Jane only missed one football game he ever played. And his wife, Claire had to learn quickly the challenges of being married to a professional athlete. In April, Coy and Claire celebrated the birth of their first child, a daughter they named Wrenn. This is a new chapter in Coy's life that he has embraced as a husband and a father.

Coy is very honored to be inducted into the West Shore Chapter HOF and he cherishes his experiences at Cedar Cliff HS and his Central PA heritage.


