




## Our Primary Purpose

Twenty-Nine chapters across the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania recognize athletic exploits of men and women who rise to the "Hall of Fame" stature.

Our primary purpose is to recognize area people who have brought lasting fame to the Keystone State through their athletic achievements as a participant, coach, official or contributor. These individuals may receive recognition after a prescribed length of time or posthumously. This recognition takes place at the Induction Banquet in the Spring.

In addition, we honor PIAA State Champions in our local high schools. At the scholarship dinner in July we also award two \$1000 scholarships and four \$500 scholarships to deserving high school seniors. We invite each high school to nominate a male and female athlete for consideration for the scholarship and invite all nominees to the dinner.

# Balaban

Rita Balaban is a 1986 graduate of Trinity high School, a 1990 graduate of Saint Joseph's University (B.A. Economics) and a 1999 graduate of the University of Pittsburgh (Ph.D. Economics). Rita, who was raised in Camp Hill, is the youngest of Thomas (late) and Margaret (late) Balaban's thirteen children. As a little girl she was usually left on the sidelines when her siblings were choosing teams, but ultimately they became her biggest fans. Rita is quick to credit her family, especially her mother, for creating an environment that encouraged her to work hard on-and-off the court.


At Trinity, Rita was a two-sport athlete, a two-time class president, and a member of the National Honor Society. Best known for her accomplishments on the basketball court, Rita owes her development and success on the court to outstanding coaches and teammates. Notably, she was coached by Pennsylvania Sports Hall of Fame member Harry DeFrank from the time she started playing basketball in 6th grade at Good Shepherd Catholic School until she graduated from Trinity High School. While at Trinity, she was also coached by another one of this year's inductees, Jeff Thompson.

Under their guidance, Rita received numerous recognitions, but most notably she was a three-time Patriot News Big 15 selection, a two-time first team All-State selection and was named to the Converse All-American basketball team in her senior year. At Trinity she was a four-year starter where she was a part of three Mid Penn league championships, three district championships (one A and two AA), and a member and co-captain of Trinity's

1986 PIAA Class AA championship team. She remains a top of the Trinity girls' record books with over 1000 rebounds and 1700 points and was inducted into Trinity High School's inaugural Sports Hall of Fame class in January 2015.

Upon graduation from Trinity, Rita accepted a full basketball scholarship to Providence College where she played one year before transferring to Saint Joseph's University where she played under Women's Basketball Hall of Fame Coach, Jim Foster. While at St. Joe's, Rita was a three year starter and played in two NCAA women's basketball tournaments and was named to the Philadelphia Big 5 All-Academic Team as a senior. During her final year of eligibility - the 1991 season - she took graduate business courses and a year later she began her PH.D. studies in economics at the University of Pittsburgh.

Today, Rita lives in Durham, NC and is senior Lecturer in the Department of Economics at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill where she has taught nearly 8,000 students in 10 years. In 2015 she received the prestigious Tanner Award for Excellence in Undergraduate Education at UNC-Chapel Hill and was recognized at halftime of a men's basketball game at the Dean E. Smith Center (a.k.a. Dean Dome). Prior to her current position, she taught at the College of Charleston (Charleston, SC) and Samford University (Birmingham, AL) She is honored to be inducted into the West Shore Chapter of the Pennsylvania Sports Hall of Fame, appreciates the recognition by the committee and is eternally grateful to her family, friends, teammates and coaches for their unwavering support.



Nicholas Berra is a 1987 graduate of Cumberland Valley High School. A two-year letterman on the CV football team, he was a member of the 1984 District 3 championship team as well as the 1985 runner-up squad. He was named to the Patriot News Mid Penn All-Conference football team his senior year as a defensive back, and as a quarterback and tailback he led the team in rushing and scoring. He was inducted into the CV Football Hall of Fame in 2002.

On the track, Nick was a four-year letterman for Coach Harry Chapman. His honors include 9 District medals including 4 titles. He was a two-time district champion in the 400m, and won the 800m in 1987 in a district record time. In the PIAA state championships Nick won 7 medals, including anchoring the Cumberland Valley 4x800m relay to back-to-back golds in 1986 and 1987. He was named to the All-State Track and Field team in both his junior and senior seasons, and held the Cumberland Valley school record in both the 400 and 800 meters for almost 20 years.

After graduation Nick attended the United States Naval Academy, where he ran both indoor and outdoor track. He was a 7-time varsity letter winner, winning gold in the Heptagonal Conference Championships 3 times and qualifying for the IC4A


championships in both his sophomore and junior seasons. Most importantly, he was a member of 5 Army-dominating squads.

He graduated in 1991 and was selected for the aviation program. He was designated a Naval Aviator in 1994, and served with distinction for almost 11 years flying on and off aircraft carriers. After leaving active duty he transitioned to the Naval Reserve, where he continued flying until his retirement in 2011.

After returning to central Pennsylvania in 2005, Nick returned to Cumberland Valley High School to volunteer with the track and cross country programs under the direction of head coach Bill Bixler. Upon turning 40 in 2009, with the encouragement of Coach Bixler, he began a second athletic career in masters track and field. Over the next 6 years Nick won 11 national titles, 4 world championships, and set the 45-49 year old world record in the indoor 800m (1:56.10) that still stands. He was also the anchor leg on two world-record relays, and was named the USATF Masters Athlete of the Year in both 2010 and 2014.

Nick currently lives in Enola PA and flies for FedEx Express. He is married to the former Melanie Cooper of San Jose, CA. They have two daughters – Lindsay, 16, a member of the Cumberland Valley swim team, and Kate, 11, a fifth-grade three sport ace.





# Glossnen

Joda Glossner graduated from Susquenita High School in 1991 where she was the valedictorian, National Honor Society president, and graduate of the Gifted and Talented program. Joda was invited to participate in Girls' State and was awarded a Leadership Scholarship to attend Lebanon Valley College (LVC).

A tri-sport athlete in high school, Joda continued to play all three at LVC, earning 12 varsity letters, National, Regional, and Academic All-America honors. She captained and was selected as the MVP for all three teams. From 1991 to 1993, the field hockey team advanced to the NCAA tournament, and in 1991 and 1992 won the Middle Atlantic Conference title. In 1994, Joda was selected to the Gallaudet All-Tournament team in basketball.

During her years at LVC, Joda served as the Sports Editor for the college newspaper and participated in various clubs and organizations. She was a Leadership Mentor to high school students, tutor, community service volunteer, and English department student assistant. Joda served as a class officer, was nominated for a Truman Scholarship, and coached in the Olympic Developmental program for field hockey as well as at numerous basketball and field hockey camps where she also served as an assistant director.

Joda graduated magna cum laude with a degree in English in 1995 and College and Department Honors. She was awarded the Senior Prize in English and won the Kappa Lambda Nu Outstanding Female Athlete Award as well as the

Phi Delta Kappa Outstanding Student Teacher Honorable Mention award.

Nominated by Kathleen Tierney, her college field hockey coach, Joda was LVC's first recipient of the NCAA Postgraduate Scholarship and in 2008 alongside Kathy was inducted into LVC's Athletic Hall of Fame. After college, Joda coached JV softball for Lebanon High School


and assisted Kathy Tierney at LVC when the team made its first appearance in the NCAA Final Four in 1996.

In 1997 and 1998, she played at the National Field Hockey Festival. In 1997, Joda played in the National Indoor Field Hockey Tournament, and in 1996 her team was runners up in the Lititz Indoor Field Hockey League. Joda was a bronze (1995) and silver (1996) medalist in the Pennsylvania State Keystone Games in the Capital Region Open Field Hockey division, scoring a hat trick in the 1996 championship game.

Joda is a contributing author on the 2007 Archives of Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation paper, "Is Stair Climb Power a Clinically Relevant Measure of Leg Power Impairments in At-Risk Older Adults?"

Joda returned to Susquenita in 1998 to teach English and coach 7th grade girls' basketball and varsity field hockey when the team won the Cedar Cliff Tournament. Joda was also recognized as Teacher of the Month.

She lives in Andover, MA with her two children whom she coaches in Little League. In 2015, Joda won second and third place ribbons in the Eastern US Dancesport Championships in the smooth and Latin categories. She runs road races, plays golf and tennis, plays in field hockey, baseball, and basketball leagues, and has twice attended the Red Sox Fantasy Camp where in 2015 she was a game MVP, and in 2016 where she was a game MVP, Golden Glove nominee, and Yaz Division champion. Also in 2016 she attended the inaugural Women's Red Sox Fantasy Camp where her team was runner up for the camp championship and she was a Golden Glove nominee. Her name appears on a bat that all campers and coaches signed and will be on display at Fenway Park until it's relocated to a soon-to-be-constructed women's baseball museum.



# Johnson

Eric Johnson is a 1989 graduate of Camp Hill High School and a 1993 graduate of the University of Richmond with a B.S. in Business Administration, concentrating in Management and Marketing. Eric remained in the Richmond VA area following an outstanding career as a linebacker for the University of Richmond Spiders; however, his athletic roots were born in South Central PA.

At Camp Hill High School, Eric was a three-sport athlete and honor student earning 11 varsity letters. As a four-year starter in football, Eric helped lead the Lions to a 41-7-1 record, winning 3 District 3 titles, and was captain of the 1988 PIAA State Championship team. Eric excelled on both sides of the ball, rushing for 1,641 yards, scoring 21 touchdowns, and registering 134 tackles his senior year. Throughout his high school career, he was fortunate to be recognized with numerous awards, including: receiving a full athletic scholarship to the University of Richmond; being named to the Big 33 team; 1988 AP Small School Player of the Year; 1988 AP 1st team All-State; 1988 Central PA Defensive Player of the Year; Multiple All-Conference and All-District awards. The Lions might have a lost a few games over his 4 years, but they were never outcoached by the leaders of the Camp Hill Lions, Steve Stoner, Tom Walton, Steve and Rick Shover.

In addition to Eric's football career, he also excelled in wrestling, finishing his career at Camp Hill High School with the most wins in school history (110-7-1). He was a four-year captain, chosen 4 times for All-Conference, 2 time Big 12/13 team member, 3-time sectional champion, 2 time district champion, advancing to the PA state tournament 3 times, placing 2 times, and finishing 4th his senior year. Although his last match was in high school, Eric credits his work ethic, commitment, toughness, and right mind-set instilled on him by his coaches, George Yeager and Joe Lazenby, for much of his success in all athletics, college, and life.


As a freshman at the University of Richmond, Eric started at the position of Inside Linebacker and went on to have a distinguished

college career. A four-year starter and captain his senior year, Eric helped lead the Spiders football program to a 7-4 record in 1992, which turned things around and laid the foundation for many great players to take Richmond to the next level. Upon completion of Eric's career at the University of Richmond, he was recognized on a few prestigious teams: 50th Anniversary All-Yankee Conference Football Team and a member of the All UR Stadium Team. Eric's final and most humbling award was his induction into the University of Richmond Athletics Hall of Fame (2006-07), placing him beside some truly amazing athletes.

Success comes as a team, and Eric is very thankful to his parents, brothers, family, coaches, teammates, and friends for always being there to support him. The success and connections he made in athletics has carried over to his professional world, where he continues to be an Agile Coach for a technology company in Richmond. Eric and his wife, Jennifer, have two amazing daughters, Ellie (10) and Avery (7), who keep him busy with new sports and adventures. And, without skipping a beat, Eric has now turned his attention to staying healthy and competitive, by having run a few half marathons, and now training to run his first full marathon in early 2016.



# McCauslin-Cadieux


Kathy McCauslin-Cadieux was born and raised in Camp Hill, PA. She started her swimming career at age 7 when she completed the week long Learn to Swim program in one hour and was recruited by the Camp Hill Swim Team. The commitment to swim all year round was one that Kathy and her family embraced in 1962 under the coaching of Rusty Owens in Hershey. By age 8, Kathy broke her first national record and was ranked #1 in the nation for the 50 & 100 backstroke. She maintained her #1 ranking throughout her 10 & under and 12 & under years.

Under the coaching of Carl Robbie, the 1968 Olympic Champion in the 100 & 200M butterfly, Kathy qualified and swam at the AAU Nationals in 3 events when she was 13 & 14 Kathy swam at the national level until she was 15 at which time she decided to only swim for the Camp Hill High School swim team. From 1969-1973 Kathy never lost a dual high school race in any of the 85 races she competed in. 1973 was the first year swimming was included in the PIAA State competition. Kathy was 2nd in the 100 backstroke, 2nd in the 200 Individual Medley and 4th in the Medley Relay in the PIAA States

Following high school, Kathy was recruited by Clarion University where she held 17 of the 21 team records. Kathy was a 4 time NCAA qualifier and ended her freshman year as a

2 time All American in the 100 Butterfly and the 200 Individual Medley. Kathy transferred to the University of Miami for a higher level of training. At UM the Women's Swimming Team won the NCAA National Championship that year. Kathy was also a 5 time NCAA qualifier, 3 time All American, NCAA champion and National record holder in the 200 Medley Relay. Kathy transferred to James Madison University after making the decision to invest more time into her studies than sport, Kathy transferred to James Madison University. Kathy finished her swimming career as the captain of the team, held 8 team records during her stay there and was a 3 time NCAA qualifier for her junior and then again her senior year at JMU. Kathy is a 1977 graduate of JMU with a BS in Education

Kathy's passion for swimming had her coaching the Camp Hill summer swim team from age 12-18 and she remained a coach in the sport until she was 40. The basketball team won the League Championship in 1957, while the baseball team won league championships in 1956 and 1957. The 1957 baseball team was also undefeated.



# Thompson

Born in Camden, New Jersey, I grew up in Chagrin Falls, Ohio, and was captain of Glenn Wyville's first championship basketball team at Chagrin Falls High School. I played baseball and basketball at Chagrin, was President of the Varsity club and a National Honor Society member. I was recently enshrined into the Chagrin Falls High School Athletic Hall of Fame.

I played baseball and basketball at Dickinson College, under Bill Rickenbach, a West Shore chapter Pennsylvania Hall of Famer, among others, in baseball and Dave Watkins in basketball, and earned honorable mention in the old Middle Atlantic Conference in both sports. In basketball, I was the MVP of the SunCoast Classic in St. Petersburg, Fla., in 1972, scoring 28 points and pulling down 22 rebounds in the finals against Brandeis U. I was awarded the McAndrews Trophy in 1972 as the outstanding Dickinson athlete. The only Dickinson College basketball player to have 300 points and 300 rebounds in two seasons, I still own the college's single season rebounding record and am the last player at Dickinson to average a career double/double.


Dickinson beat Bucknell University in Lewisburg in OT our junior year. That win was the last time Dickinson beat a major college squad in basketball. It also cost the Bucknell head coach his position. Bucknell named Jim Valvano as their new coach. We faced his squad in our last home game our senior year. Earlier that month, John Thompson, Jr., brought his Georgetown University team to Carlisle to help celebrate the 200th anniversary of the founding of Dickinson College. In front of over 2,000 fans packed into Alumni gym, a baseline 10 foot jumper with five seconds left erased what was once a ten point Dickinson lead, as Georgetown escaped with a 66-65 victory, and according to John Thompson himself, probably saved his job.

I was tapped into the Raven's Claw Society, a tradition for seven senior men at Dickinson College since 1896. I coached as an assistant at Dickinson for two years, before moving on to become an assistant for Rodger Goodling at Shippensburg. I served as a JV coach at Cedar Cliff and Trinity, and then a 9th grade coach at Cedar Cliff. My first head coaching position was with the Trinity High School girls. In my second year coaching at Trinity we were the Mid Penn II champions and won the school's first ever state game. We continued with a most improbable run to the PIAA championship game, finishing as Eastern champs. The following year, with a young group, we again won the district title as well as earning a trip to the Eastern finals in a higher classification.

When I left to coach the Varsity Boys at Mechanicsburg, my assistant coach at Trinity, Harry DeFrank, a Pennsylvania Hall of Fame inductee nominated from the West Shore Chapter, carried on the Lady Shamrock tradition, winning the state title with that nucleus.

Mechanicsburg hadn't had a winning season in twenty three years when I took over in 1984-85. Blessed with talented athletes during my seven years tenure, we won one hundred games, two Mid Penn titles and were the first team to qualify and move up a division in the Mid Penn league. After Mechanicsburg, I enjoyed a sixteen year stint as coach of the Blackhawks of Susquenita, fueled by athletic, committed and competitive athletes. We won the first conference championship in Susquenita boys' basketball history during that run. I was an assistant at Central Dauphin for a year and took over as head coach at Upper Dauphin for two years, ending with 412 victories as a head coach at the high school level. For the last five years, I've been the 9th grade boys coach at CV. Throughout my coaching tenure, I've been a school counselor, serving the West Shore, Susquenita and Cumberland Valley schools.

I'd like to sincerely thank the coaches I have played for and worked with over the years, my teammates at all levels and the many student-athletes whom I've coached. I have the deepest appreciation for and owe a debt of gratitude to my wife, Cindy, and the family we raised on the West Shore: Christy, Whitney, Stephen, Karen, and Julianne.



George Yeager is a 1967 graduate of Trinity High School. He was a three-sport athlete in football, wrestling and track and field. He was the starting center and defensive tackle for 4 years on the football team. He held the discus record at Trinity for many years before it was broken. George was inducted into the Trinity Sports Hall of Fame in the spring of 2015.

George followed his stellar high school career at Bordentown Military Institute, NJ lettering in football, wrestling and track. He was named to the All-Prep football team and 2nd Team All-State at Bordentown as a center and defensive tackle.

After Bordentown, he attended Lock Haven State College and lettered in football as an offensive and defensive tackle. He also wrestled during his freshman year, but left to enlist in the Marine Corps. He served three years in the USMC and one tour in Vietnam. In 1971 George played on the US Marine Corps football team at Quantico. He received a scholarship to play football at the University of Tennessee at Martin. George played, lettered and started three years at offensive tackle at UT-M. His junior year he was named Most Valuable Offensive Lineman. George graduated with a degree in Physical Education and Health in 1974.

George then began a long and distinguished career as a local teacher, coach and Athletic Director. At Harrisburg High School, George was an assistant football coach for 11 years, head wrestling coach for 6 years (assistant 1 year) and track assistant coach for 9 years. During this time, he received his Master of Education/Principal Certification at Western Maryland College. After Harrisburg High School, George went to Trinity High School where he was the head football coach for 4 years and a track assistant coach for 4 years. During this time at Trinity, George was also the head wrestling coach at Camp Hill High School. Following a brief return to Harrisburg High School, George came to Camp Hill High School full time as Athletic Director and Dean of Students. He was the Athletic Director for 18 years, serving

on many Mid-Penn committees. He also was the head wrestling coach for 4 years, a football assistant for 16 years and a track coach for 18 years. George retired from education in 2010.
