


Undrafted out of high school he continued his baseball career at Duquesne University in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania. B.J. still holds six Duquesne single-season hitting records and five career records in just three years of play. In 1997, he was the Atlantic 10 Rookie of the Year and named to the Louisville Slugger Freshman All-American Team. In 1999, he was named Atlantic 10 Player of the Year after leading the conference and finishing third in the country in batting average with a .456 mark. His three-year career average of .412 is a Duquesne record as are his 47 doubles, 49 home runs and 161 RBI. In 1999, Barns was also named a Second Team All-American by the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association.

Barns in the sixth round. He made his pro debut in 1999 at Williamsport (A), but was quickly promoted to Hickory (A) mid-season after batting .400 11 RBI in 14 games. In batted .241 with seven home runs and 35 RBI. In 2001, after opening the year in Lynchburg. He was promoted to AA Altoona, where he hit .220 (24-109) with six home runs and 15 RBI in 30 games. After entering the 2002 season rated the "Best Defensive Outfielder" in the Pirates organization, he completed the year with his best offensive season while at Lynchburg. Barns improved his average to .268 (131-489) while belting 12 homers and knocking in 70 runs. He was also named the Carolina League Player of the Month in May. Barns spent the first half of 2003 with Altoona before being traded to the Tampa Bay Devil Rays where he finished his career with the AA Orlando Rays. He returned to Duquesne in the fall of 2004 and graduated in 2007 with a Doctorate of Pharmacy degree. He married hi wife Christine in 2004, and they now have 3 boys, Evan (8), Jackson (6) and Walker (4). He currently resides in Lebanon, NH and works as a Clinical Pharmacist specializing in Infectious Diseases at Dartmouth-Hitchcock Medical Center.


Served as head coach at Eastern Lebanon Country HS (1984-85), Conestoga Valley High School (1985-86), Susquenita High School (1988-93), Cumberland Valley High School (1993-2004), and Mechanicsburg High School (1986-87, 2007-12).

During his coaching career, he had the privilege of coaching 49 Sectional Champions, 143 District Qualifiers, 61 District III Place Winners, 23 District III/Regional Champions, 47 PIAA State Qualifiers, 23 PIAA State Place Winners, 6 PIAA State Finalists and 3 PIAA State Champions.

His team qualified 13 times for District III Team Championships, 7 times for Mid-Penn Championships, 5 times for Sectional Championships, 3 times for District III Team Championships, 2 Times District III Team Runner-Ups, 5 times District III Tournament Champions, and were 5 times Top Ten PIAA Finishers.

Dwight attended Cedar Cliff from 1967 until 1970 receiving variety letters in both football and track during his high school years. He started as a defensive back for three years and as a running back for two years. In his senior year, Dwight rushed for 1570 yards, caught 32 passes, and scored 17 touchdowns in leading Cedar Cliff to a 9-2 record. Dwight served as one of the co-captains his senior year and was nominated for Big 33.

Dwight also participated in track and field at Cedar Cliff receiving 3 varsity letters for his performance. At the time of his graduation, Dwight held the school records for both the 880-yard and 440-yard runs. He also was part of the one-mile and two-mile relay teams that set school records in both of these events. Dwight qualified in his senior year for the 440-yard dash in the PIAA track and field championships by finishing second in the District 3 championships.

Dwight was also an outstanding student athlete at Cedar Cliff graduating 4th in a class of over 400 students. Dwight was a member of the National Honor Society and served as the Student Council President in his senior year.

Dwight received offers from over 45 colleges his senior year choosing to attend Temple University in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. Dwight attended Temple from 1970 to 1974

and received 3 varsity letters in football as a defensive safety. Dwight was selected as the outstanding defensive back for Temple in both his junior and senior years. In addition, Dwight was selected as the team Captain in his senior year with the team finishing the season with a 9-1 record. Temple led the nation in interceptions during Dwight's senior year with Dwight leading the Temple defense with 5 interceptions.

Academically, Dwight excelled while at Temple as a student athlete and was selected to be a member of the Phi Beta Kappa academic honor society for this outstanding performance in the classroom.

During his Junior High, High School, and College careers Dwight had the privilege of playing for three Hall of Fame coaches: Wally Witmer at New Cumberland Junior High School, Bob Craig at Cedar Cliff High School, and Wayne Hardin at Temple University.

Following graduation from Temple University, Dwight had a tryout with the New York Giants. After not making the team, Dwight applied for medical school and was accepted into the medical program at Temple University. During his first two academic years in medical school, Dwight stayed involved in the Temple football program serving as a scout for the Temple football team.



Angie Loy Reisinger is a 2000 graduate of West Perry High School and a 2005 graduate of Old Dominion University with a B.S. degree in Health and Physical Education. Angie's family lives on a dairy farm near Louisville in western Perry County. Farm life gave Angie her work ethic and physical fitness.

At West Perry, Angie was a three-sport athlete and honor student. She played field hockey, basketball, and track - captained both field hockey and basketball her senior year. In field hockey, Angie had 65 goals and 27 assists totaling 158 points and achieving the 100 point club. She was an all-state selection, West Perry's MCP, and Sentinel's Player of the Year helping West Perry to the second round of states.

Angie also excelled in basketball being MVP and joined the 1000 point club with 1554 and Big 15 selection. She helped West Perry to the first round of states. In track, she was MCP for 300 hurdles and placed 6th in districts. As a result of her senior accomplishments, she was awarded the Carlisle Sentinel and West Perry Female Athlete of the Year.


West Perry's field hockey coach, Mary Jane Moyer, was instrumental in getting the sister team of Becky and Angie to attend ODU on scholarships. ODU was a field hockey powerhouse and Coach Beth Anders was tremendous at winning by instilling the importance of basic fundamentals. After Angie's first season of scoring 18 goals, she was awarded the Colonial Athletic Association Rookie of the Year and helped ODU win the NCAA Dic I National Championship for the 9th time. In her senior year, she was CAA Player of the Year, tournament MCP, 1st Team All American, 1st team All-CAA, and 1st team All South Region all for the second time as well as four time NFHCA Academic All-American. Angie ranked second in the nation points and assists

her senior year. He totals at ODU were 77 goals and 52 assists. In 2012, she was inducted into the ODU Hall of Fame.

In December 2003, Angie was chosen for the US Field Hockey Team and missed her final semester at ODU to help the US qualify for the 2004 Olympics. The US lost to Korea-not qualifying. Angie returned to ODU and help to coach the Monarchs and later graduated in 2005 from ODU. After her 2005 graduation, Angie devoted herself full-time to the US team playing field hockey around the world. She traveled to 13 different countries. Angie's international field hockey career included 114 games and 32 goals. Angie was high scorer in the 2008 Summer Olympics in Beijing, China with 4 goals. She scored the tying goal against Argentina who was ranked 2nd in the world. The US Team entered the Olympics ranked 11th and ended in 8th place in the world.

Angie was chosen by Coach Lee Bodimeade of the US Team to be the 2007 USA Women's Field Hockey Player of the Year. Her name is engraved on a silver plate with other players of the year. Rep. Mark Keller of the State House of Representatives also presented a House citation to Angie. West Perry retired her jersey and inducted her into the 1st group for the West Perry Hall of Fame in 2009.

After the 2008 Olympics, Angie retired from the US Team. She volunteered to help coach field hockey at Shippensburg University for one year while helping on the family farm. Since Angie did not find a teaching job, she became a partner in Loy Acres dairy business, married, and now has a little girl and boy. She's very happy and proud to have had the athletic experiences and gained lifelong friendships. Angie now enjoys being on the farm nurturing a close family and teaching her children values that last a lifetime and can be learned in no other way.



Craig Roberts was born in the Western Pennsylvanian town of New Kensington in 1953. Due to his father's career in politics the family was moved to the Harrisburg area in 1956 and settled in Camp Hill. Craig began in gain an interest in sports at an early age due to his two older brothers, Laurie and Randy, who were high school standouts in athletics. It was not long before Craig entered Camp Hill High School and began to receive some recognition.

He was a three year letterman in football from 1968-1970 while playing for coaches Harry Finkelston, Ken Miller, Harold Bricker, Clyde Rohland, William Kimmich and Harold Bear, During his three years playing at CHHS the teams were a combined 27-2-1 including an undefeated 10-0 team in 1969. In his senior year, he received several honors such as All State and Big 33 nomination. Craig accepted an athletic scholarship to the University of Kentucky in 1971.

In basketball, he also lettered three years and was part of an extremely successful run under coaches Ed Nugent and Lewis Dougerty. Camp Hill was undefeated in all three years in Blue Mountain League play. Craig was a member of two Class B district championships in 1970-71. The 1971 team went all the way to the state Class B championship game before losing to Midland in Pittsburgh. Honors received for basketball included All State mention and Harrisburg area Big 15 in both 1970 and 1971. In his three years playing basketball the only losing games he playing in were in district or state tournaments, a total of three.


In track and field Craig threw the shot and ran the 440 yard dash and on relays. His primary coach in track was Clyde Rohland. He was the BML shot put title his junior and senior years as well as the Shippensburg Invitational his senior year. Craig finished third


the district meet with a school record throw of 52'9" that stood

Following high school Craig was recruited as a defensive end and enrolled at the University of Kentucky. John Ray was the UK head coach at the time. Following his freshman year an injury caused Craig to give up football and he enlisted in the Army. After serving 3 years from January 2973 brought December 1975 including tours in Japan and Korea he was honorably discharged. Craig returned to UK to finish out his football career. Coaches at UK were head coach Fran Curci and position coaches Billy Mitchell and Bill Glaser. He lettered in each year from 1976-78 and was a member of the 1976 victorious Peach Bowl team as well as the 1977 #6 ranked nationally team that finished 10-1 and co SEC champions. After his senior year, Craig was chosen as a member of the All Academic SEC team as a defensive end. Academically he excelled and was graduated as a member for Phi Betta Kappa.

After five years working with the State Dept. Craig decided to move to a warmer climate and get into coaching and teaching. In the mid 1980's he received a Masters degree in kinesiology from Sam Houston State University in Huntsville, Texas. Coaching quickly lost its interest to him but he continued to teach in several schools in Huntsville and Conroe, Texas retiring last year after nearly thirty years.

Thanks go to the committee that selected him for this recognition. Knowing that someone remembers the successes of his youth makes an old man smile. Also to the coaches mentioned and teachers unmentioned that have influenced his life. most important, however, is thanks to his family who have encouraged and supported him throughout his athletic life - brothers, Laurie and Randy, and an always devoted mother Bertha.

> Sawyer also earned two football letters as he started at cornerback in 1966 and 1967. In his freshman season, Sawyer led Grove City with Five interceptions. The Wolverines finished that year 8-0-1 overall. Sawyer graduated with a bachelor of science degree in mechanical engineering before pursuing a career as a sales engineer in the HVAC industry.

> Post graduation, he coached youth baseball for 12 years and played for over 20 years in the West Shore Twilight


